"I used to show and train dogs," she said. "And my own dogs were scratching, losing their hair, going bald. So I started doing some research on nutrition and diets, and decided to switch my dogs to a more natural pet food."

There was just one problem: The nearest vendor was in Houston. So she made the long trip, loaded up her truck, and brought it home to her dogs. Within weeks, their coats were clearing up.

"I feel like I was sort of forced into business," she said, with a laugh. "In order to get the food into Las Cruces, I had to order large quantities. I had to become a distributor. Before long, we were delivering to El Paso, Silver City and as far away as Los Alamos and Taos."

In the years since, natural pet foods have become very popular, and have become widely



available.

"What people don't realize is that we've been doing this for so long, we've got great relationships with the manufacturers whose foods we carry," she said. "And

we've got the buying power to match or beat the prices you'll find at the big chain stores."

Having recently expanded to a second location, Better Life Pet Foods has expanded the products and services it offers.

"We started installing ponds, really focusing on natural ecosystems," Lacy said. "We've expanded to aquariums for both freshwater and saltwater fish. And we're carrying natural foods for a larger spectrum of animals, including birds, reptiles, fish and organic chicken feed. We're also offering in-home aquarium service."

Of course, they still offer home delivery. Both locations have a do-it-yourself dog wash, and the Avenida de Mesilla location offers grooming and boards cats.

"Hopefully, Better Life will not only provide a better life for pets," Lacy said, "but for their owners, too."

Local facility provides world-class care

Rehabilitation Hospital of Southern New Mexico and Advanced Care Hospital of Southern New Mexico are two distinct facilities, each with unique but complementary missions, operating on the same campus. Together, these two treatment centers bring a level of world-class care to our community.

For the past eight years, RHSNM has been rated in the top 10 percent of all inpatient rehab hospitals in the United States – out of 843 participating facilities.

“Our guiding principles really put the patient at the center of our care, and always putting the patient’s needs first and foremost,” said RHSNM COO Sabrina Martin. “Everybody has a vision and a mission statement, but our guiding principles really sustain the quality of care that we give, that’s what separates us.”

At Advanced Care Hospital, a 20-bed acute care facility, exceptional medical care is the norm. Most patients are critical upon admission, many still on ventilators, and most return home within 25 days. ACHSNM treats patients healing from catastrophic or

chronic illness or injury, first weaning them off ventilators, and then beginning therapy. “There’s a lot of intensive therapy,” said ACHSNM COO Claudia Saiz. “We have a very rich therapy department, offering speech therapy, physical therapy, and occupational therapy. But the goal is to get patients through our continuum of care, and get them able to go home, and back to their lives.”

Sometimes ACHSNM patients who aren’t quite ready to transition home get transferred to RHSNM for continued treatment.

“I would say about 10 percent of patients who are discharged from Advanced Care meet the criteria to go to Rehab Hospital, and then usually home,” said Suzanne Quillen, the Area CEO who oversees both hospitals.

“So many people say, ‘I didn’t even know that you were here, but thank goodness you are,’” Saiz said. “When a patient from Las Cruces has been recovering in El Paso, and we can bring them here, to recover close to home – that’s huge. It’s gratifying to alleviate that hardship on their family members, who are so important to the rehabilitation process.”
